EDUCATION:

Zbigniew Mrowiec is a graduate of the Faculty of Law and Administration of the Warsaw University and the Faculty of Law of University of Bonn.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE:

In 1999, Mr. Mrowiec was admitted to the list of legal counsels of the Regional Chamber of Legal Advisers in Warsaw. In 1990, he was employed at the Ministry of Finance and from July to October 1992, he worked at the Lim Sp. z o. o. In 1990-1991 he worked at the Ministry of Ownership Transformation and from 1991 to 1994 he was working in Polish Securities and Exchange Commission. In 1995 he became a Head of the Legal Office at the National Depository for Securities. In 1996-2000, Mr. Mrowiec was a lawyer in the international law firm Hunton & Williams, where in 2000 he became a partner. In 2002-2004 he was a partner at Dewey Ballantine and from 2004 to 2005 he was the Deputy Chairman of the Polish Securities and Exchange Commission. Between 2005 and 2009 he was a Partner at Dewey & LeBoeuf and in 2009-2014 Zbigniew Mrowiec was a partner at Allen & Overy. Since 2014 he is the co-founding partner at the Mrowiec Fiałek and Partners law firm. Mr Mrowiec comes with extensive experience in the area of capital markets, including highly innovative complex transactions, and has extensive knowledge of the regulatory aspects of securities trading. He advised on many pioneer transactions, such as the first takeover of a company listed on the Warsaw Stock Exchange, first hostile takeover, first delisting, first dual listing of foreign issuer's securities on the WSE, and only fourth equity issuance in the EU, during which the financial market supervision authority of the issuer delegated the rights to approve the prospectus to the supervision authority of the country, in which the initial public offering was held and in which trading of company's securities is conducted. Zbigniew Mrowiec specialises in capital market transactions, including acquisitions of public companies, structuring of IPOs and issuance of debt and equity securities on the Polish and foreign markets. He also has a broad experience in providing advisory services to private equity funds. As Deputy Chariman of the Polish Securities and Exchange Commission (March 2004 - October 2005) Mr. Mrowiec worked on amending the regulations of the Polish capital market to facilitate regulator's supervisory functions, and to liberalise the market and enhance its transparency. Mr Mrowiec coauthored new regulations of the capital market, the Act on Investment Funds, the Bond Act, amendments to the Act on public trading of securities and secondary laws to this Act.
